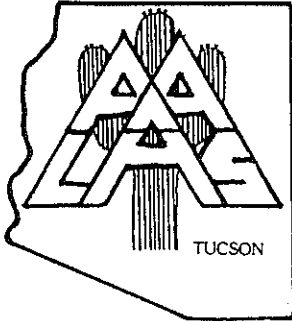

MINUTES OF THE PAST MEETING

The meeting was held at the College of Medicine in Room 5120. President, Jane Criswell called the meeting to order at 12:05 p.m. She announced that the first item on the agenda was the meeting which would be followed by our guest speaker.

Jane waived the reading of the minutes of the last meeting on 8/26/91. Jane then gave a brief summary of the Fall Symposium held September 27 and 28, 1991. Overall opinions were very positive and those who attended liked the hotel and the presentations. Those who participated in the after symposium hayride and cookout had a good time. An estimate of net receipts amounted to @\$496. Not all receipts are in so this figure may change.

Kathy Stollberg gave a report on the National Meeting held on October 20 - 24, 1991 in Buffalo, New York. She stated that the meetings which she attended were very interesting and informative and she enjoyed them. The one problem she noticed was that the hotel arrangements had many of the participants too far away to attend all the meetings.

Casey Kilcullen Steiner gave a report of the Board of Trustees meeting. It has been noted that National members have been subsidizing non national members in charges such as for the bulletin and for certification exams. In the future there will be a surcharge on exams of \$50 for non national members. Casey also pointed out the fact that national will be held in District 8 in 1992. Hosting National will cost approximately \$54,000 and as such District eight branches will be asked to make donations to the hosting branch (Southern California). She suggested offering \$1000 to the branch before we had to be asked. Casey also mentioned that since she won Member of the Year for 1991 she is entitled to go to the District meeting in 1992, but with national in Anaheim there will be no district meeting. She asked whether we should send people to the national instead of waiting and sending them to District in 1993. All present agreed that the award winners should go to National. As a Trustee, Casey would already be going to National and therefore suggested a contest be held to send the winner in her place. Contest rules will be decided later. Casey pointed out that Arizona Branch will be hosting District Eight in 1997.

Jane then gave a financial report as of October 1 and not including the bill for the hotel. The branch has approximately \$7000. Since we have carried the same approximate amount since the district eight meeting held in Tucson in 1987 there should

not be a problem with donating \$1000 for the national next year. A vote was taken on donating this amount and was passed.

Jane mentioned that the board had decided on December 6 for our Christmas Social, but as Tribranch will be holding there's on the same night, it was decided that we would change ours to the 7th to allow a larger attendance. Jane offered her home for this years event and the branch will once again provide coldcuts and drinks.

Jane showed the branch the poster of buttons offered by the branch for \$1 each. Also shown were the CFAAR buttons which support animal research.

Jane introduced the guest speaker - Harry Hueston, Assistant Chief of Police, University of Arizona who spoke on "*Animal Rights - Action & Future.*"

Meeting was adjourned at 12:55 p.m.

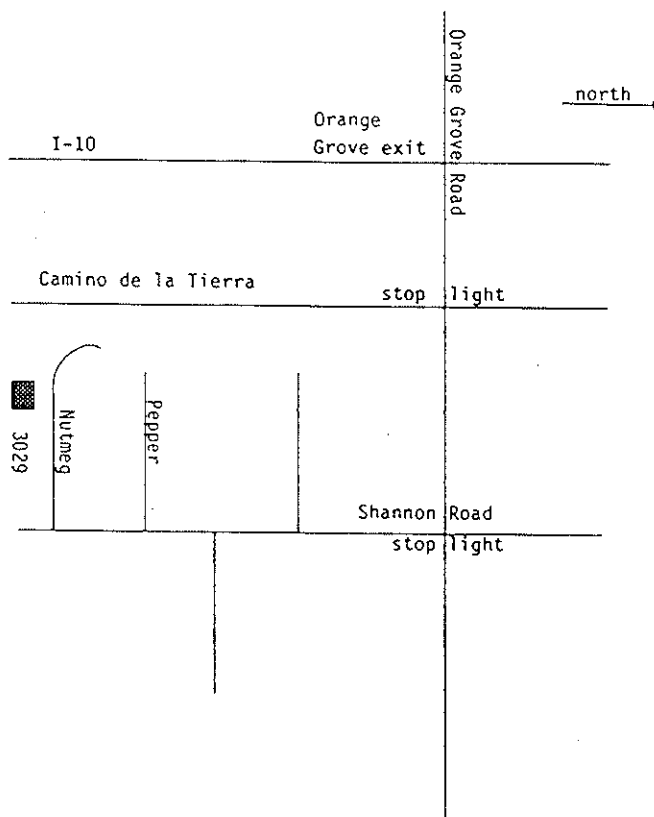

DATES FOR AALAS EXAMINATIONS

AALAS has an Animal Technician Certification Program which serves two main purposes. It provides a mechanism for developing standards of competence for people who work in the field of laboratory animal science and it recognizes people who meet and exceed these standards by awarding them certification at three different levels: Assistant Laboratory Animal Technician, Laboratory Animal Technician, and Laboratory Animal Technologist.

In order to qualify for AALAS certification, applicants must pass their exams (written and practical) and meet educational and experience requirements which are outlined in the AALAS publication 83-1, "The Animal Technician Certification Program".

The minimum requirements to take the exams at each level are:

- (1) Assistant Laboratory Animal Technician - must have completed grammar school, have 6 months of work experience in a laboratory animal facility and have education in animal science and/or relevant work experience totaling another 6 months.

(2) Laboratory Animal Technician - must have completed high school, have 2 years of work experience in a laboratory animal facility and have education in animal science and/or relevant work experience totaling another 2 years.

(3) Laboratory Animal Technologist - must have completed high school, have 2 years of work experience in a laboratory animal facility and have education in animal science and/or relevant work experience totaling another 3 years.

Provisional certificates for all three certification levels are given to those applicants who meet the educational requirements and pass the examination (practical and written), but who do not yet meet the experience requirements. A provisional certificate is valid for 3 years.

A candidate may apply for provisional certification once the education requirement is met and his or her instructor makes the recommendation.

Once the experience requirements have been met, the candidate may apply for full certification.

WHAT'S NEW IN THE NEWS

Heflin Bill Passes U.S. Senate

S. 544, the "Animal Research Facility Protection Act," was approved by unanimous consent by the U.S. Senate on October 16. This bill, introduced by Senator Howell Heflin (D-AL) on March 5, protects research facilities from the illegal activities of animal rights extremists. Specifically, S. 544 makes it a federal crime to steal, destroy, or make unauthorized use of research animals, equipment or data.

The Heflin bill as approved included several clarifications. The section entitled PROHIBITED ACTS was changed to more precisely reflect the intent of the legislation. Among the prohibited acts when the bill was introduced was "to receive, conceal, or retain any material, equipment, or animals of any research facility, knowing them to have been stolen." This language was deleted and replaced with the two prohibited acts: (5) to aid, abet, counsel, command, induce, or procure the commission of aforementioned prohibited acts; (6) knowing an offense has occurred, to receive, relieve, comfort, or assist the offender in order to prevent the offender's apprehension, trial, or punishment.

The sections entitled PENALTIES, COURT JURISDICTION, PRIVATE RIGHT OF ACTION AND STUDY OF THE EFFECT OF TERRORISM ON CERTAIN ANIMAL FACILITIES were not affected by the amendment.
